Job purpose

• The purpose of the Environmental Education Specialist is to develop and implement education and outreach activities related to waste reduction and recycling programs in Perry County. Prepare, distribute and/or present educational activities to schools, businesses, industries, or other youth/adult groups interested in litter prevention, recycling, composting, reuse, natural resources and waste reduction. Provide outreach assistance to school systems, local businesses, municipalities and organizations to implement recycling programs within Perry County.

Duties and responsibilities

- Develop and conduct presentations for various audiences throughout Perry County.
- Organize and conduct special activities and events such as: Fairs, Festivals, School Health Walks, After School/ Environmental Clubs, awareness displays, adult/youth workshops, Earth Day Celebrations in partnership with District Library and community partners, Battery Recycling Collections
- Conduct waste audits to businesses, schools, offices and industries throughout Perry County.
- Organize Adopt–A–Road/ Adopt-A-Spot cleanup groups and other Litter Collection Events.
- Organize and implement contests and contest judging, i.e. Defining REUSE Oral History Scholarship, Green School Challenge/Waste Reduction Challenge, Billboard Contest
- Publish Business & Industry program newsletters; also partner with PSWCD to publish Educator Newsletter (both currently entitled "The Greener Side-Providing a Green Perspective...")
- Organize and Update Local Recycling Listing and other brochures.
- Update program website, create social media content, and make daily social media posts.
- Work with schools on special events such as environmental days, special subject related and classroom projects, i.e. Compost Experiment, Recycled paper programs, Trash Suitcase, Recycle Relay, etc.
- Conduct adult education and awareness presentations.
- Promote program activities and events.
- Keep statistics to complete necessary reporting requirements.
- Work with schools, youth groups and community organizations to promote program participation and increase recycling.
- Assist citizens with solid waste, recycling and litter prevention concerns.
- Attend training for program/professional development.
- Submit news releases and articles.
- Appear on radio and television programs promoting special events and program activities.
- Assist the Director in accomplishing program goals and objectives.
- Conduct Daily, Weekly, Monthly, Quarterly, and yearly reporting.
- Assist Schools with Curriculum Development.

Qualifications

- Must have a Bachelor's Degree in Education, Environmental or related field.
- Must have experience in the use of Microsoft Word, Excel, Outlook, Publisher, PowerPoint, and all social media platforms.
- Must possess excellent verbal and written skills, and ability to do group presentations.
- Ability to work well with others; interact with teachers, community members, governmental agencies, grant applicants, supervisors, other staff, and board members.
