Job Duties:

The Public Information Specialist is a full-time position with medical/dental/vision benefits offered. This is a grant funded position with employment guaranteed through June 2025. The position is within the administration of Perry County Job and Family Services, in the division of Perry County Child Support Enforcement Agency (CSEA) and reports to the CSEA supervisor. The programming will focus on established criteria to educate and encourage those aged 13-25 to, "Get On A Life Sequence", for the purpose of promoting the Economic Mobility Responsible Parenting (EMRP) initiative.

- Administer CSEA Economic Mobility Responsible Parenting (EMRP) program
- Develop education programming for CSEA No Kidding Ohio Curriculum for the EMRP & GOALS initiative
- Plan, develop, and implement peer education curriculum centered on EMRP & GOALS criteria
- Assist with operation and supervision of the EMRP GOALS program
- Train peer educators to lead the EMRP GOALS education sessions
- Act as Supervisor for peer educators
- Prepare communications, brochures, press releases and informational material
- Acts as contact for the public for EMRP GOALS
- Educates the public on EMRP GOALS via public speaking and event appearances
- Utilize all forms of media and technology to communicate initiative messaging
- Act as liaison between agencies, community partners and the public
- Develop a system of outreach
- Attend conferences, meetings, and trainings as required and appropriate
- Analyze, track and report on program data
- Coordinate and advance multiple project goals
- Excellent communication skills to included public speaking
- Operation of computer and various computer programs
- Operation of office equipment
